Sunday 9 June: Scaln Mass 2024.. on the Feast of St. Columba! – This year's Mass at Scaln **will take place on Sunday 9 June** (the Feast of St. Columba), at 4.00pm. Principal Celebrant and Homilist: Very Rev. Domenico Zanrè VG. Scaln is the site of a hidden seminary, located in the Braes of Glenlivet, and during the 18th century, more than a hundred 'Heather Priests' were trained there. For those with sat navs, the postcode is **AB37 9JS**; this will take you to Chapeltown of Glenlivet – please walk, or ask for a lift from others, for the last 1½ miles.
